Overall, it was a fun-filled day for everyone - students, parents, and teachers alike!



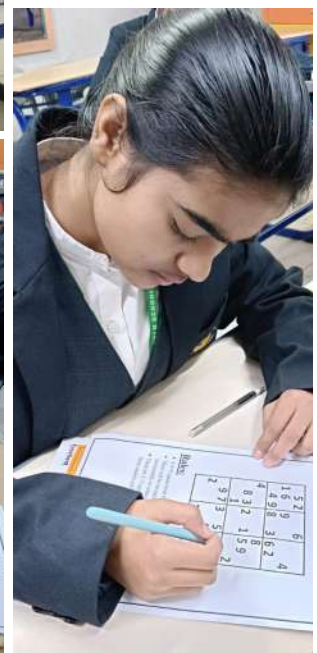
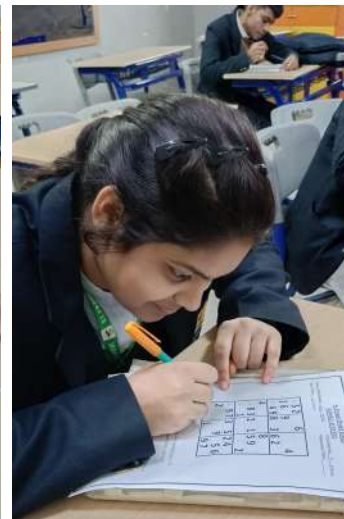
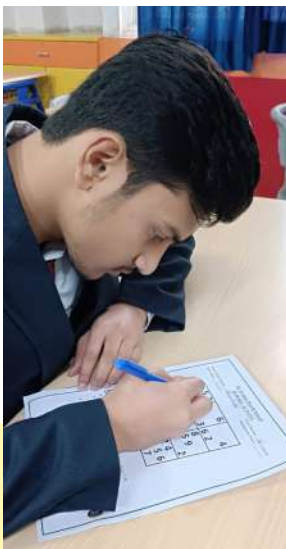
Sudoku problem solving Activity

Origami Activity

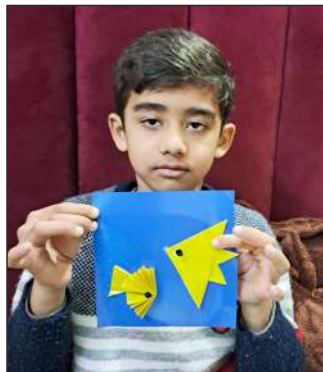


Artistic skills at display"

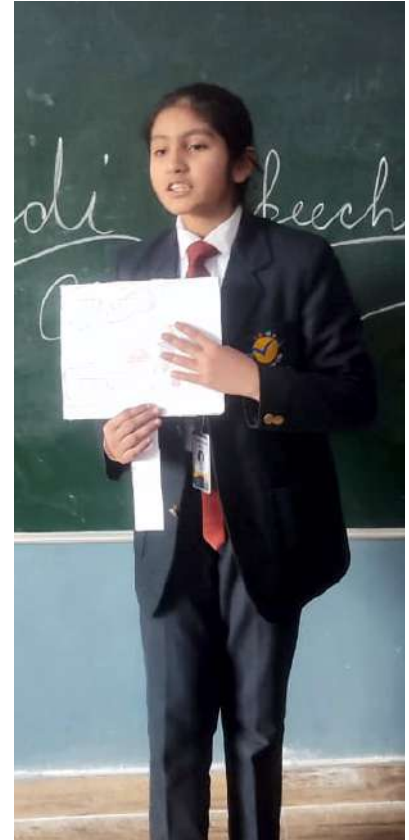
This engaging activity fostered a playful learning environment encouraging imagination among the budding artists.
